1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Shri Baneshwar Shikshan Sanstha's, Arts, Science and Commerce College, Burhannagar, Ahmednagar was sanctioned in the year 2003 and actually the college started since the academic year 2004. The college is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University. College teachers implement the curriculum prescribed by Savitribai Phule Pune University. Accordingly, the college conducts the courses as per the objectives of the course.The college prepares academic calendar for academic events. Various events are organized accordingly. The principal of the college guides the student and the teacher regarding the planning of the academic year. The college runs 17 academic programmes. All these courses are implemented in a planned manner.College teachers participate in workshops related to the revised curriculum. This helps in implementing the revised syllabus in the college. In all the departments of the college, the schedule of the course is prepared by the time table committee. And the workload is divided among the teachers according to that schedule. All department heads routinely monitor the implementation of this schedule by all teachers. The principal reviews each session to confirm whether each teacher has covered the course neatly. Teachers are evaluated through feedback by the students.

College implements the curriculum prescribed by Savitribai Phule Pune University. Accordingly, continuous internal evaluation is carried out as per the guideline of Savitribai Phule Pune University.

For Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE), at the beginning of the academic year, with the help of Internal Quality Assurance Cell, an academic calendar is prepared for all the departments, including university and internal examinations, workshops, sports competitions and other activities.

Since the college is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, after announcement of the academic calendar of the university, necessary changes are made in the academic calendar of the college in tune with the university. In addition to the university examinations, internal

examinations are conducted to evaluate the students understanding. Students are guided according to their intellectual ability by separating slow learners and advance learners according to their H.S.C. performance.

Advance learners are guided from time to time by the teachers to participate in inventions and other competitions organized by the university. Remedial classes are organized for slow learner for their intellectual development. Based on that, students are re-evaluated by taking remedial tests. In addition, tutorials, home assignments, open book test, group discussion, seminar, surprise tests are conducted to enhance the quality of education.

Shri Baneshwar Shikshan Sanstha's, Arts, Science and Commerce College, Burhannagar has working since 2004. Since then, the internal evaluation system has been transparent and robust. Undergraduate level Savitribai Phule Pune University Pune's internal evaluation is done in the college as per the norms and guidelines Term end examinations are conducted as per the pattern of 2013. According to score of term end exam 60 marks are converted to 20 for B.A., B.com. Assessment for B.Sc. degree is the internal examination is conducted by the college at the end of the semester. Its coefficient is 10 marks. At the beginning of academic year, a time table is prepared for internal examination office with CCTV and internet connectivity. The college has appointed an internal senior supervisor and an examination officer for the examination. Subject Teacher of each subject are prepared two sets of Term End Exam Question Papers. Examination is done considering PO and CO. The internal assessment process involves regular evolutions conducted at multiple level to ensure comprehensive coverage. The frequency of assessment is predetermined, with clear schedules and timeline.
